It is a state university, which was established while this neighborhood was a district not very far from Athens, and it was important for this school to exist here for the development of agriculture at that time. Today (nearly after 100 years) I think that, since the place appears to be more like a museum, it should be moved in a district of central Greece, where there are vast areas and experts to transfer directly the school knowledge through experiments into the productive land, as well as stu-



dents, who will try new practices and ideas supported by the farmers. So, what should we do in this holy land that will remain, that is over 100 acres as far as the Plato's parks is concerned and large amounts of land, like 120 acres of the Agricultural School on the right side of Iera Odos street, and quite as much from the other side, that is a total of 340 acres of public land.


If we succeed a regular circulation, we will present in every issue texts of a great Ionic philosopher of today's Turkey, as they chronologically appeared in our wider area and left behind written texts, so as to reach the Athens golden era of today's Greece, which have been created later influenced by the Ionians.

This great civilization, despised by the Christian-Byzantine domination, found affection and has been translated from great Muslim philosophers of the era 820 ac and later. We will start to promote them in parallel.. It is something important, because, except common Alexandrian era, there was a hot chain, between classic Greeks and Muslim philosophers, who transferred classic civilization in Europe, in the era of Christian darkness, through translations and their new studies. As a third target would be to suggest to the communist parties of the region to search out -through intelligentsia- a new thought, by using some positive elements of capitalism, relative to productivity, and especially to cover the big gap of normal and fast changing succession in power, in order to create a new experiment in the science of sociology, as the great Marx inaugurated

In the framework (of this experiment) the

old religious institutions will be transformed into a collective civil instrument, and they will offer their services to the citizens, without caring about their religion, and the citizens will be concentrated in their everyday life and problems, instead of thinking of their dogmatic differences and the miracles of the saints.

Through this experiment also, the free working businessman will return the property they have done, up to the time they will retire, to the society, so to be entrusted to someone who has more abilities than their natural heir. In this transformation, the economic institutions of our planet (banks) could serve in a more modern and popular way today.

According to Bertrand Russell, western, philosophy begins with Thales." Thales attempted to explain natural phenomena without reference to mythology, and was tremendously influential in this respect. Almost all of the other pre-Socratic philosophers follow him in attempting to provide an explanation of ultimate substance, change, and the existence of the world-without reference to mythology. Those philosophers were also influential, and eventually Thales' rejection of mythological explanations became an essential idea for the scientific revolution. He was also the first to define general principles and set forth hypotheses, and as a result has been dubbed the "Father of Science", though it is argued that Democritus was actually more deserving of this title. In mathematics, Thales used geometry to solve problems such as calculating the height of pyramids, and the distance of ships from the shore. He is credited with the first use of deductive reasoning applied to geometry, by deriving four corollaries to Thales Theorem. As a result, he has been hailed as the first true mathematician and is the first known individual to whom a mathematical discovery

has been attributed. Also, Thales was the first person known to have studied electricity. Thales, however, aimed to explain natural phenomena via a rational explanation that referenced natural processes themselves. For example, Thales attempted to explain earthquakes by hypothesizing that the Earth floats on water, and that earthquakes occur when the Earth is rocked by waves, Heraclitus Homericus states that Thales drew his conclusion from seeing moist substance turn into air, slime and earth. It seems likely that Thales viewed the Earth as solidifying from the water on which it floated and which surrounded Ocean. According to Herodotus, Thales once predicted a solar eclipse which has been determined by modern methods to have been on May 28, 585 BC. Thales involved himself in many activities, taking the role of an innovator. Some say that he left no writings, others that he wrote "On the Solstice" and "On the Equinox". Neither has survived. About his personal life Diogenes Laertius reports two other stories, one that he married and had a son, The second is that he never married, telling his mother as a young man that it was too early to marry, and as an older man that it was too late. A much earlier source -Plutarch tells the following story: Solon when he visited Thales asked him the reason which kept him single.

Thales answered that he did not like the idea of having to worry about children. Nevertheless, several years later Thales, anxious for family, adopted his nephew The dates of Thales' life are not known exactly. Diogenes Laertius quotes that he died at 78 in the Olympiad (548–545), and Sosicrates that he was 90 at his death.

In Baghdad at that time was working the house of wisdom which was inaugurated the Caliph Xaroum -al-Rasid ,and was completed by his son Al-Ma'moun who governed the Caliphate from 813 up to 833. The house of wisdom was an example of library where were translated many texts from different cultures like , Chinese, Persian , Indian and mostly Ancient Greeks, to the Arabic language .Also organized conference between scientists to exchange ideas ,and classify the books by scientist. From the Greek side were translated ,Pythagoras, Plato, Aristotle, Hippocrates and Euclid . The All-Kindi as a prominent personality in the house, was suggested by the Caliphs to control the translators in texts of the Greeks mostly, as well as Chinese Persian and Indian ones to the Arabic language . His touch with the classic thinking drove him to write hundreds of texts in his own studies, in matters as metaphysic, ethic ,logic, psychology, pharmacology,

mathematics, astronomy, astrology, meteorology, zoology, Philosophy, geometry..Also in mathematics he transfers and improved the Indian arithmetic system, that in the final form dominated the word as Arabic numeral. The Geralomo kartano an Italian thinker of renaissance, has consider him as one of the twelve bigger minds of the middle ages. He has written at least 160 books, from which 32 for Geometry, twelve for physic. lot of his books have been lost and in the few survived, are and some translated in the Latin language by the Gerard of Cremona, and some in Arabic language. Also 24 of his lost books were founded in the middle of 12th century in a Turkish library. the death of Caliph all-ma'moun in 833 his successor brother al-Mu'tasim improved his prestige and undertook the education of his son. Unfortunately with the successor of Al -Mu'tatasim al-Kindi's star waned. There was rivalries with new scholars, he was accused as unorthodox Muslim, his library temporally confiscated, and he was beaten

too. He died alone and forgotten in 873 in Bagdad, this gifted personality, who is considered today as the father of Muslim philosophy, the first who organized translations of the greatest Greek thinkers, and the pioneer of the greater coming Muslim philosophers ,in the coming time .More than three centuries in the cold era, of the Islamic civilization.

During the last years in the same place, the Greek Stock Market is already running, in favor of the wealthy Arabs (kings or not) and Russians to keep their power, making here their "wall street" of an intermediate and hopefully united place, that is a common country



ICNY programs work to connect religious leaders and their communities with civil organizations and each other.

The founder was born in January 7, 1930 after his retirement from 25 years as Dean of the Cathedral of St. John the Divine. According to its Certificate of Incorporation, ICNY was organized "for the purpose of promoting interfaith dialogue and harmony among all of the world's religions and the prevention and resolution of conflicts arising there from."

The idea to found the center arose out of the increasing religious diversity Rev. Morton saw in New York City, and his desire to utilize the network of religious leaders he had cultivated during his tenure at the Cathedral of Saint John the Divine.







Education Programs focus on increasing knowledge and understanding about the religious diversity present in New York. Programs include workshops, panel discussions, and forums for teachers and students in various educational settings. The National Endowment for the Humanities sponsors a summer institute for K-12 teachers called Religious Worlds of New York

Domestic Violence Training Programs work with religious leaders to educate and train them about domestic violence resources. Domestic violence programs are co-sponsored by CONNECT

Saudi King Abdullah Commences Interfaith Dialogue Conference in Madrid, Spain

July 17, 2008

Kings Calls on Representatives of Major Faiths To Find Common Ground

[Madrid, Spain] -- Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques King Abdullah, along with his host King Juan Carlos of Spain, has opened the World Conference on Dialogue by calling on the true believers of the world's leading faiths to defeat extremist viewpoints, find common cause and foster a spirit of peace. King Abdullah stated that major divisions among the faiths of the world were not caused by individual beliefs in God but by deviant viewpoints and misinterpretation.

"We all believe in one God, who sent messengers for the good of humanity in this world and the hereafter," said King Abdullah. "God's will, praise be to Him, was that people should differ in their faiths. If the Almighty had so desired, all mankind would have shared the same religion. We are meeting today to affirm that the religions that God Almighty desired for the happiness of man, should be a means to ensure that happiness.

The World Conference on Dialogue, which is taking place in Madrid, Spain, brings together representatives of Islam, Judaism, Christianity, Hinduism, Buddhism, Shintoism and Confucianism to reinforce the common values shared by their respective faiths.

This conference follows a dialogue among Islamic scholars that took place in Makkah, Saudi Arabia in June. Last year, King Abdullah met with Pope Benedict XVI, in the first meeting between a Saudi King and the leader of the Catholic Church.



Saudi Ambassador to the United States, Adel Al-Jubeir, said: "The idea stemmed from King Abdullah's view that there are universal values that are common to all faiths, and that if we focus on those universal values we will see that there is a lot more that binds us as human beings, than divides us." The conference is focusing on four major themes:

- 1. The importance of dialogue in human society
- 2. The foundations of religious and civilizational dialogue
- 3. The common human aspects in dialogue
- 4. The evaluation and promotion of dialogue

King Abdullah concluded: "If we wish this historic meeting to succeed, we must focus on the common denominators that unite us, namely, deep faith in God, noble principles, and lofty moral values, which constitute the essence of religion."
